Preventing Childhood Obesity Community Scholarships

Scholarship requirements:

- Must be a high school senior pursuing a bachelor's degree, living in the Omaha Metropolitan Statistical Area (Cass, Douglas, Sarpy, Saunders and Washington counties in Nebraska, and Harrison, Mills and Pottawattamie counties in Iowa).
- Must be pursuing a career related to health and/or wellness (e.g. nurse, dietitian, health teacher, physical therapist), with an exclusive or significant focus on children and/or adolescents.
- Must submit a personal essay (1,000 words maximum) regarding how you will make a difference in the fight against childhood obesity through your college education and future career.
- Must submit a letter of support from an adult who can advocate for your commitment to a career in health and/or wellness (e.g. guidance counselor, teacher, community volunteer, professional mentor) and is not a family member.

Scholarship Details:

- Five \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded.

- Applications are due Friday, March 10, 2017 at 5 p.m.
- Scholarships will be renewed for up to 3 years, dependent on recipients' academic standing and relevant area of study.

- Scholarship recipients will be announced and honored at a formal check presentation in May 2017.

IT Leadership Forum Technology Scholarship

The IT Leadership Forum Technology Scholarship is a \$1,000 scholarship awarded to Iowa high school seniors who have been involved in STEM classes or clubs and plan to pursue a technology-related degree at an Iowa college, university or community college.

Four of last year's winners are now computer science majors (with two double majoring in music). Eleven have an engineering-related major. Two recipients were Eagle Scouts. Twelve were in the National Honor Society. One competes in pageants. Three were in 4-H.

To be considered for the scholarship, applicants must meet the following criteria and provide the requested information:

1. The applicant must be an Iowa resident and high school senior graduating in the 2016-2017 school year.
2. A minimum 3.0 high school grade point average (4.0 scale) is required.
3. The applicant must enroll as a full-time student.

5. Provide a high school transcript (can be submitted online).
6. Provide two letters of recommendation (can be submitted online by reference).
7. Write an essay (minimum 500 words; instructions provided within online application).

Fraser Stryker Diversity Scholarship Program

Fraser Stryker is proud to announce that it will once again offer the Fraser Stryker Diversity Scholarship Program ("Program") for Omaha-area high school seniors. The general purpose of the Program is to provide (a) financial assistance in the form of college tuition and (b) paid student internships to students of African-American, Asian, Latino, and Native-American origins from low income families in the Omaha metro area who are interested in pursuing a career in law. Fraser Stryker has offered two scholarships each year since 2007 and will offer two scholarships for the 2017-2018 academic year.

The Program consists of two components. First, the Program will provide up to a \$2,500.00 scholarship for each recipient's use during the 2017-2018 school year (or, to the extent such expenses are less, the lesser amount), which is renewable for up to three subsequent school years (up to \$10,000.00 total). The scholarship funds will be available for the recipient's use in paying for tuition, books, fees, and supplies for school. Second, recipients are eligible to participate in a paid internship at Fraser Stryker during the first summer after the recipient's first year in college, subject to renewal at the discretion of Fraser Stryker.

Upon completing the application and providing the required attachments, applicants are directed to submit the completed application to you by no later than March 10, 2017. In turn, we ask that you submit your school's completed applications to us by no later than March 17, 2017. Your cooperation in submitting timely applications is sincerely appreciated.
